It is recommended that Oblates renew their Oblation at least once a year. This practice is very helpful in having Oblates persevere in the promise which they made at the time of their Final Oblation. Renewal of Oblation may be done privately or in common with a group of Oblates as we did at Sacred Heart Monastery last month. If you make it privately, use the suggested form at the end of this newsletter. Send the form to me after you renew your Oblation. You can do this any time, but the feast of Pentecost, May 20, or St. Benedict, July 11, are good days to renew your Oblation.

Sister Maribeth Wentzloff and I traveled to Sioux Falls, SD, on May 9, 2018, for the Oblation Ceremony. One Oblate transferred into the Sioux Falls Chapter and the rest renewed their Oblation. Ginny Cheek, a faithful member of their group, died on Sunday, May 6, 2018. May she rest in peace!

OBLATES REGIONAL GATHERING AT ST. BENEDICT'S RETREAT CENTER, SCHUYLER, NE

The monks at Christ the King Priory, Schuyler, NE, have agreed to host the 2018 Oblate Regional Meeting on September 8-9, 2018, at their Retreat Center. Father Volker Futter will be the host, and he has reserved 30 rooms for religious and Oblates who plan to attend this meeting and stay overnight. The cost for a single room is \$44.00 for a night and \$37.00 per person for a double room. Meals are not included so breakfast is \$7.50, noon meal is \$8.95, and the evening meal is \$9.70. When you register for a room, you will need to tell them which meals you will eat.

The focus for the weekend will be looking into the future of Oblates and their role in Benedictine life and in society. Oblates will be carrying a vital part in religious communities as membership is declining and aging. Also, Oblates carry a powerful witness in and for society. Oblates will be the bridge of what has been or what will be. We can never underestimate the giftedness of the Oblates. Monastery Happenings during December & January

We have heard several performances of the MMC Choral groups in our Bishop Marty Memorial Chapel under the direction of **Dr. Brandon Connell, Mount Marty Choir Director**. Each performance was outstanding. The MMC Band, under the conductor Scott Olson, gave several concerts in Marian Auditorium. Four of our Sisters; **Kathy Burt, Candyce Chrystal, Corinne Lemmer, and Debra Kolecka**, as well as several adults from the college and Yankton also perform with the college band.

In early April **Sisters Maribeth Wentzlaff, Sharon Ann Haas, and Mary Kay Panowicz** attended the LCWR New Leadership Workshop at Mundelin, IL. Later that month **Sisters Maribeth and Sharon Ann** went to the LCWR (Leadership Conference of Women Religious) Regional Meeting at St. John's University in Minnesota.

Sisters Corinne Lemmer and Marlene Stetz attended a Stephen Ministry Workshop in Sioux Falls, SD, in April. Stephen Ministry congregations equip and empower lay caregivers—called Stephen Ministers—to provide high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting.

At the last large cohort of the Spiritual Direction Ministry Formation Program in April, eleven women were certified as spiritual directors. Three tutorial participants finished their second term and shared their residency. Several groups of spiritual directors have scheduled reunion retreats this summer.

Five women participated in the Triduum Retreat during Holy Week at Sacred Heart Monastery.

The fifth grade pen pals from Sacred Heart School, Yankton, SD, enjoyed a picnic on the patio with their Sister pen pals. It was the last meeting with the pen pals for this year. On the same day the fifth graders from St. Mary's School in Sioux Falls, SD, had a mini retreat and tour of the Monastery.



Sisters Clarice Korger and Kathy Burt traveled to the University of Mary in Bismarck, ND, for the Third Annual Vocations Jamboree. The keynote speaker was Dr. Gianna Beretta Molla. Dr. Molla is the child with whom her mother, St. Gianna, was pregnant when she was diagnosed with cancer. Since her mother died a week after her birth, Dr. Molla travels to countries to tell her story. She also visited friends in Lincoln, NE, during her visit to the United States.

Our Sisters are still supporting alternatives to the death penalty in SD. Three speakers gave a panel discussion for all the Sisters on human trafficking in SD. Besides being most informative, they alerted us to the places in the community where human trafficking takes place. Please pray for an end to this violent crime.

Father Valerian Odermann will return to his Monastery in Richardton, ND, for the summer. During that time Abbot Adian Parcher from Lacey, WA, will assist us.

Mike and Gerrie Healy joined us for prayer and supper in April as we recognized them for being the Yankton Citizens of the Year 2017. We prayed a blessing over them at the meal and thanked them for all they have done for the Sisters over the years.

Sister Kathleen Crowley completed her term on the Avera Board as a System Member. **Sister Penny Bingham** has been appointed to fill Sister Kathleen's position. Sister Penny also will be an assistant to **Sister Candyce Chrystal** in the Education Department of MMC while Sister Candyce serves as the Interim Dean of Academic Affairs this next year. **Sister Candyce** was recently recognized as the *Marquette University's School of Education 2018 Alumni of the Year*. She was chosen for the impact that she has made in education.

Sacred Heart Monastery will host the Novice and Director Institute the last weeks in May. **Sister Sharon Ann Haas** is organizing and directing this NADI and many of the Sisters are giving presentations. There are 8 Novices and 8 directors from throughout the United States participating in this Institute.
